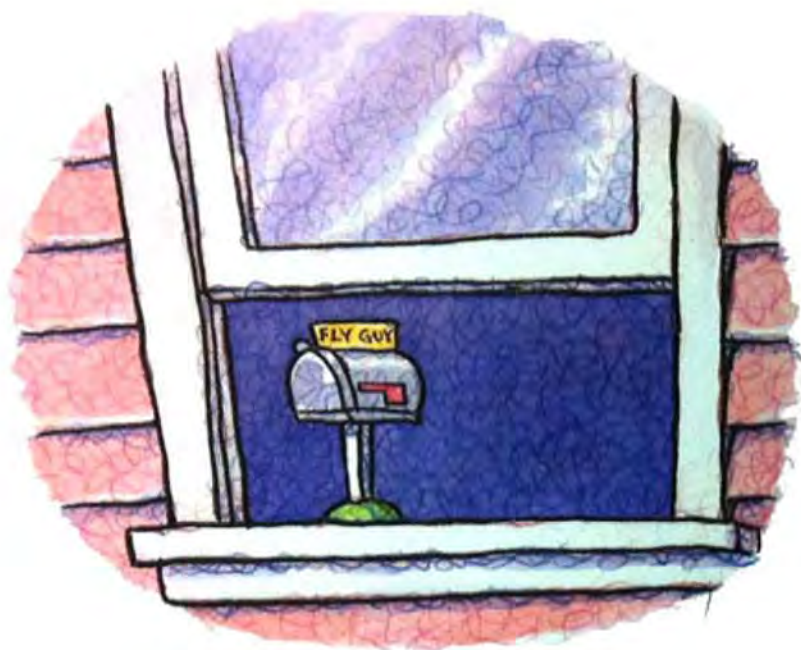

A boy had a pet fly.

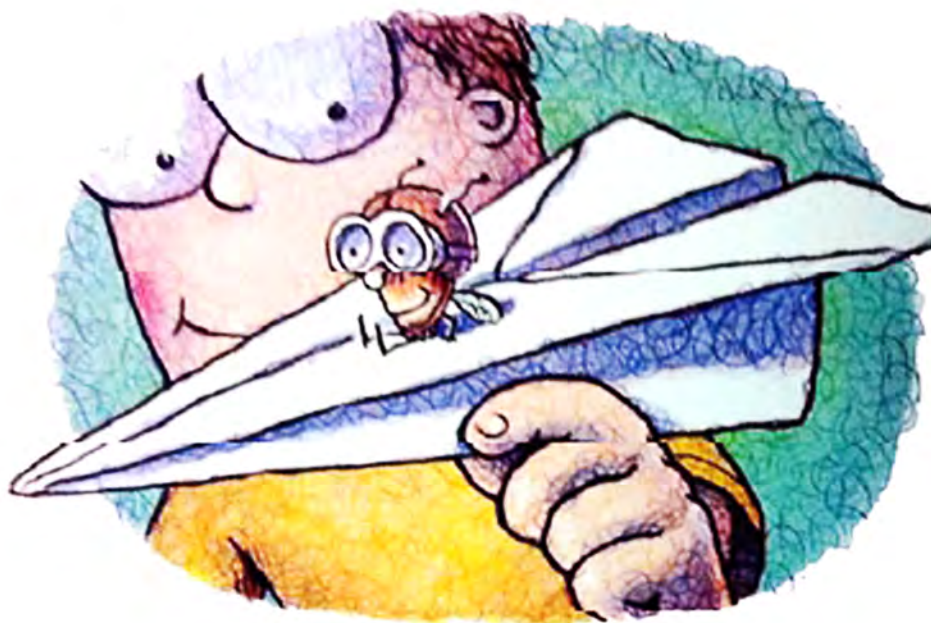
The boy called his pet Fly Guy.

name—

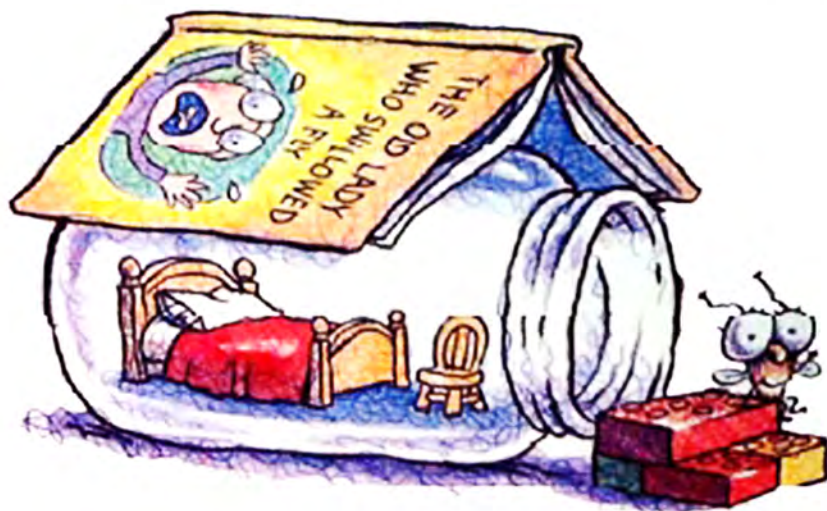
BUZZ!



Buzz played with Fly Guy.



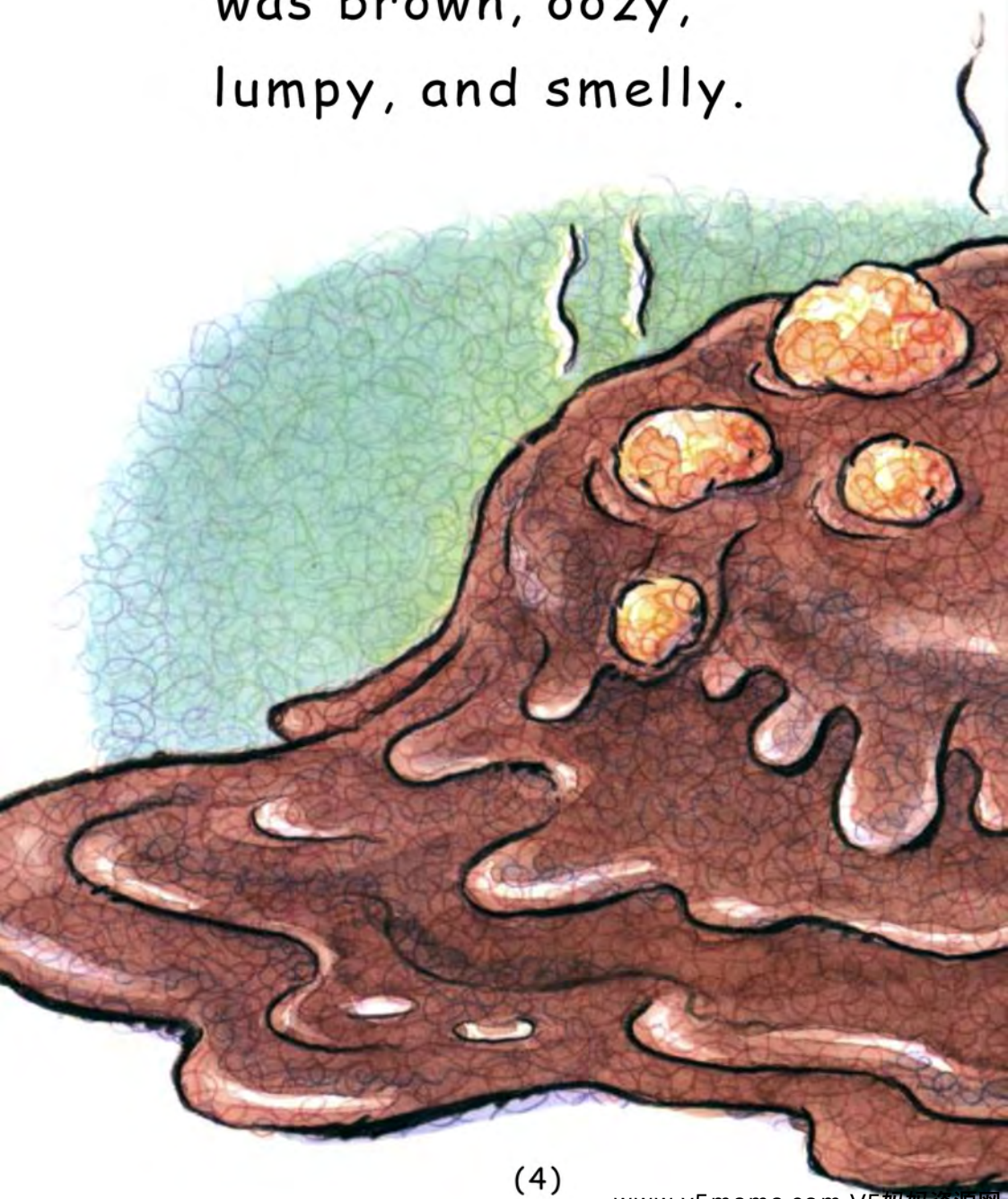
Buzz made him a glass house.

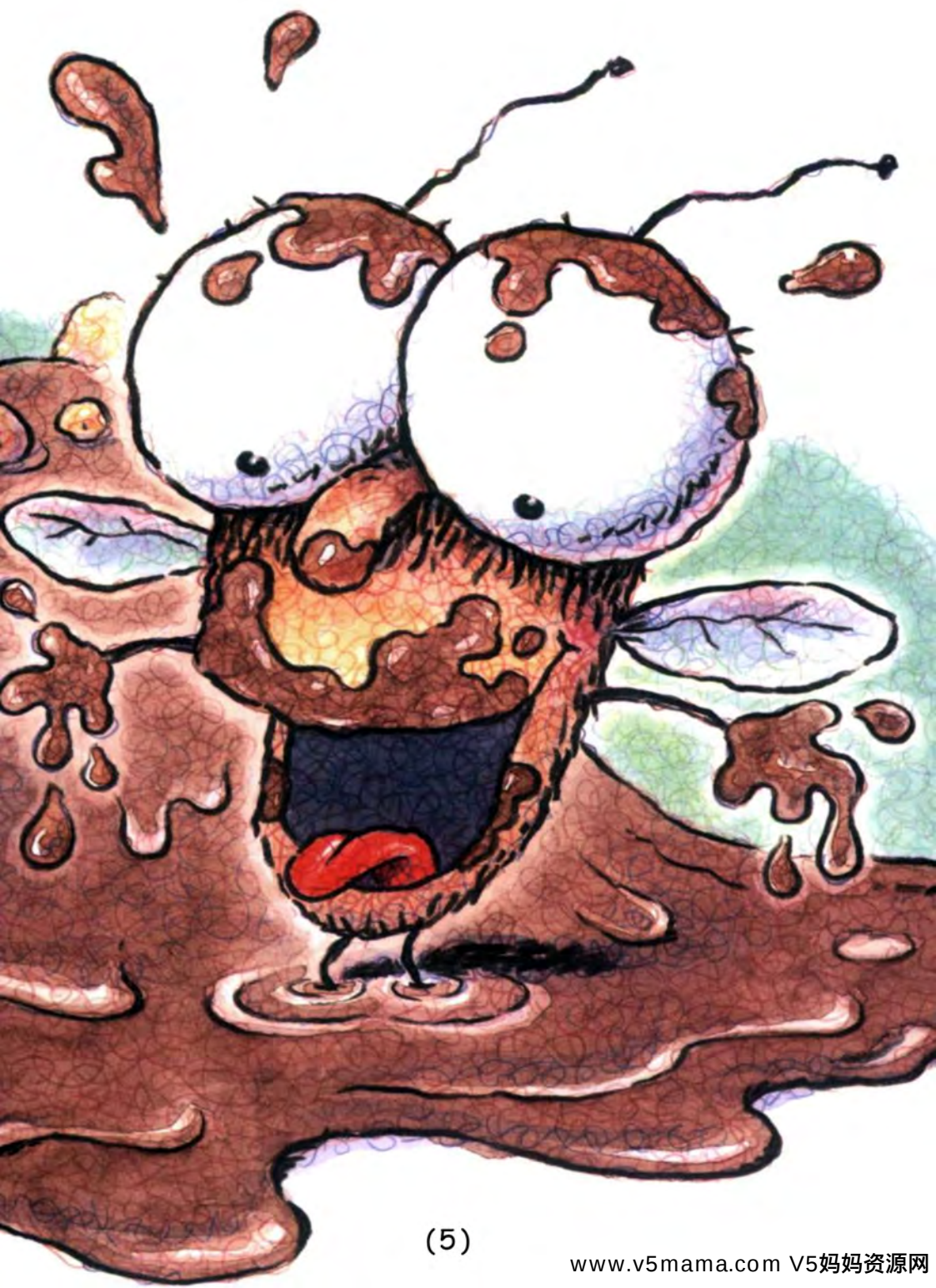


Best of all, Buzz fed him.

lumpy, and smelly.



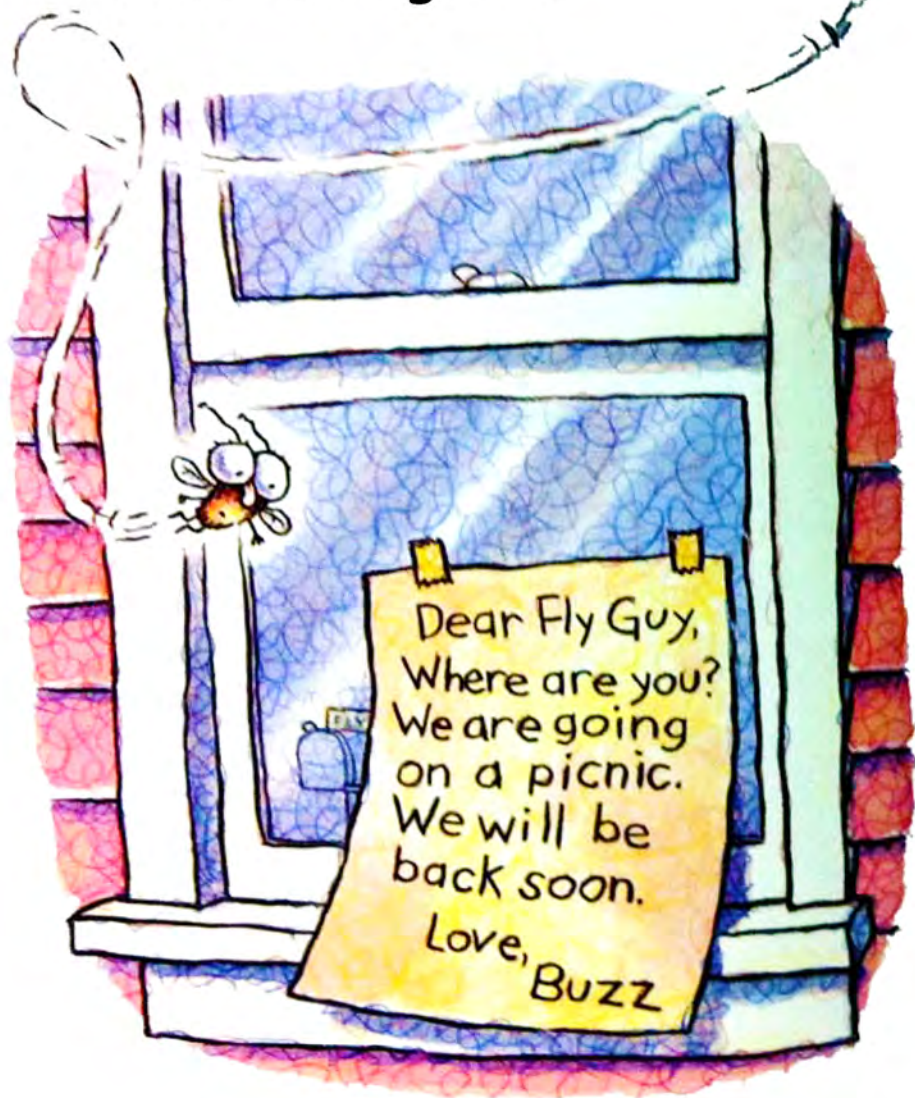


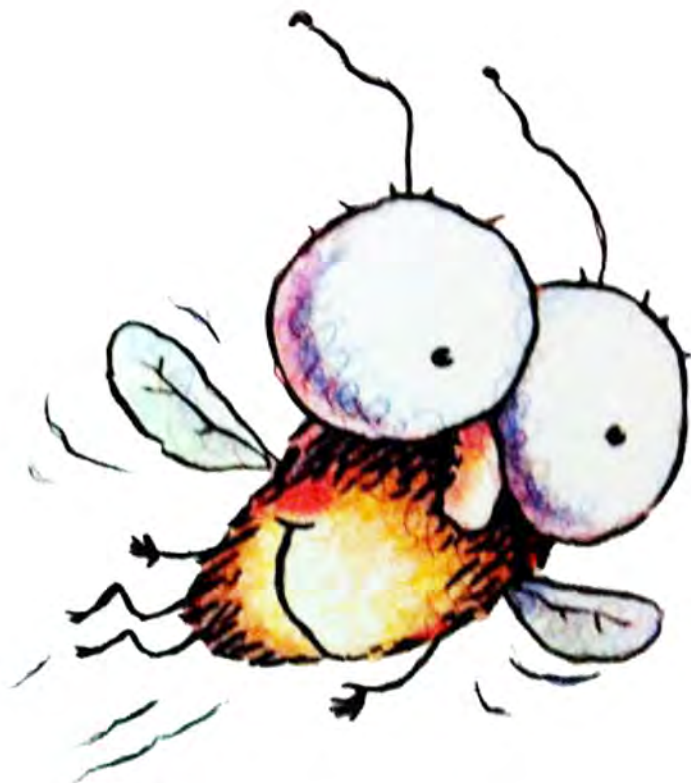
One day Fly Guy went
flying by himself.





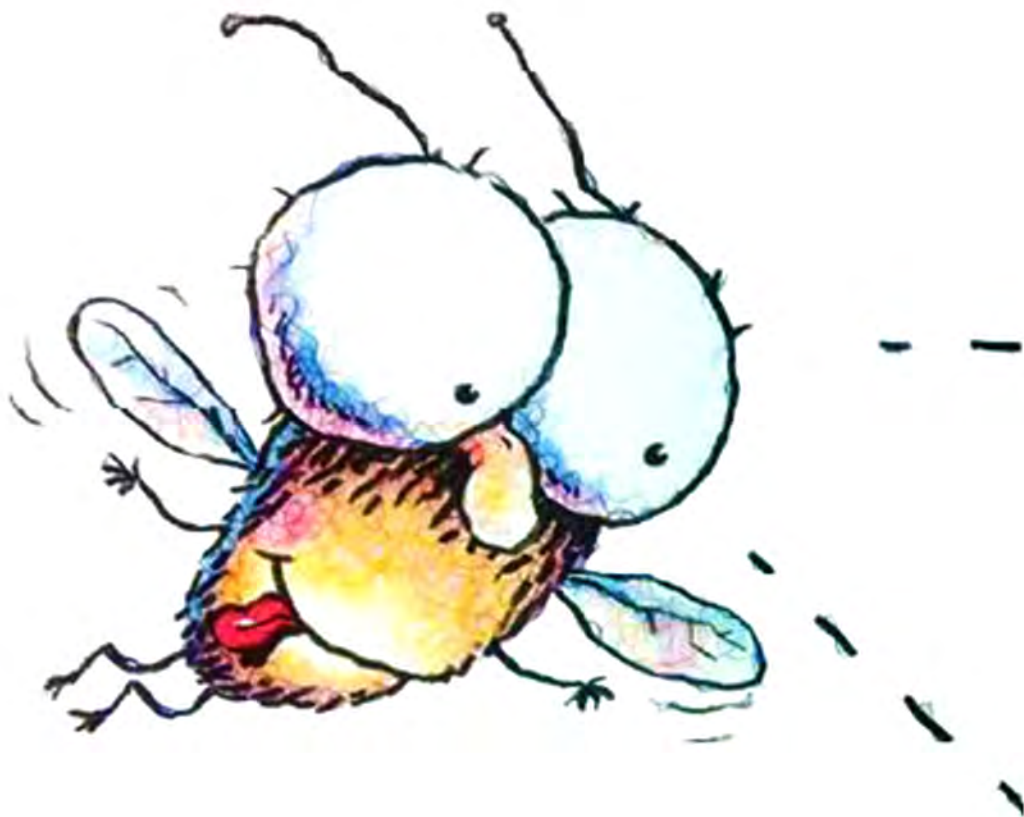
When he came home,
Buzz was gone.





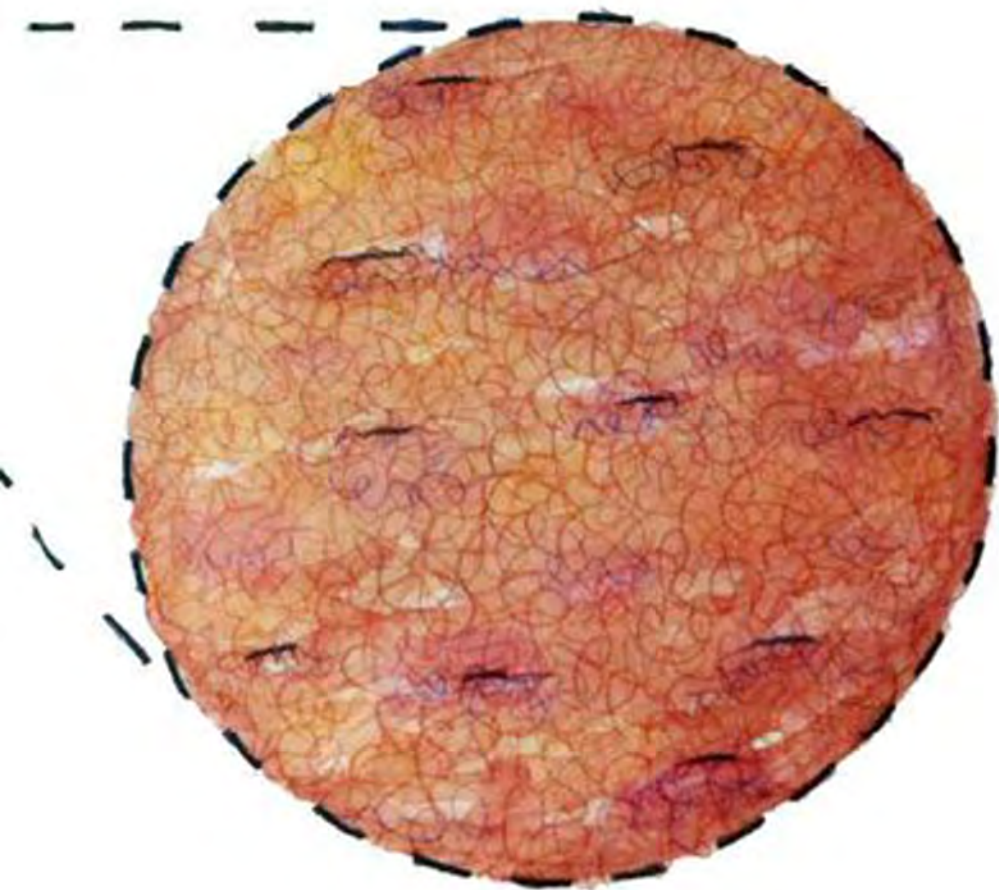
Fly Guy was hungry.

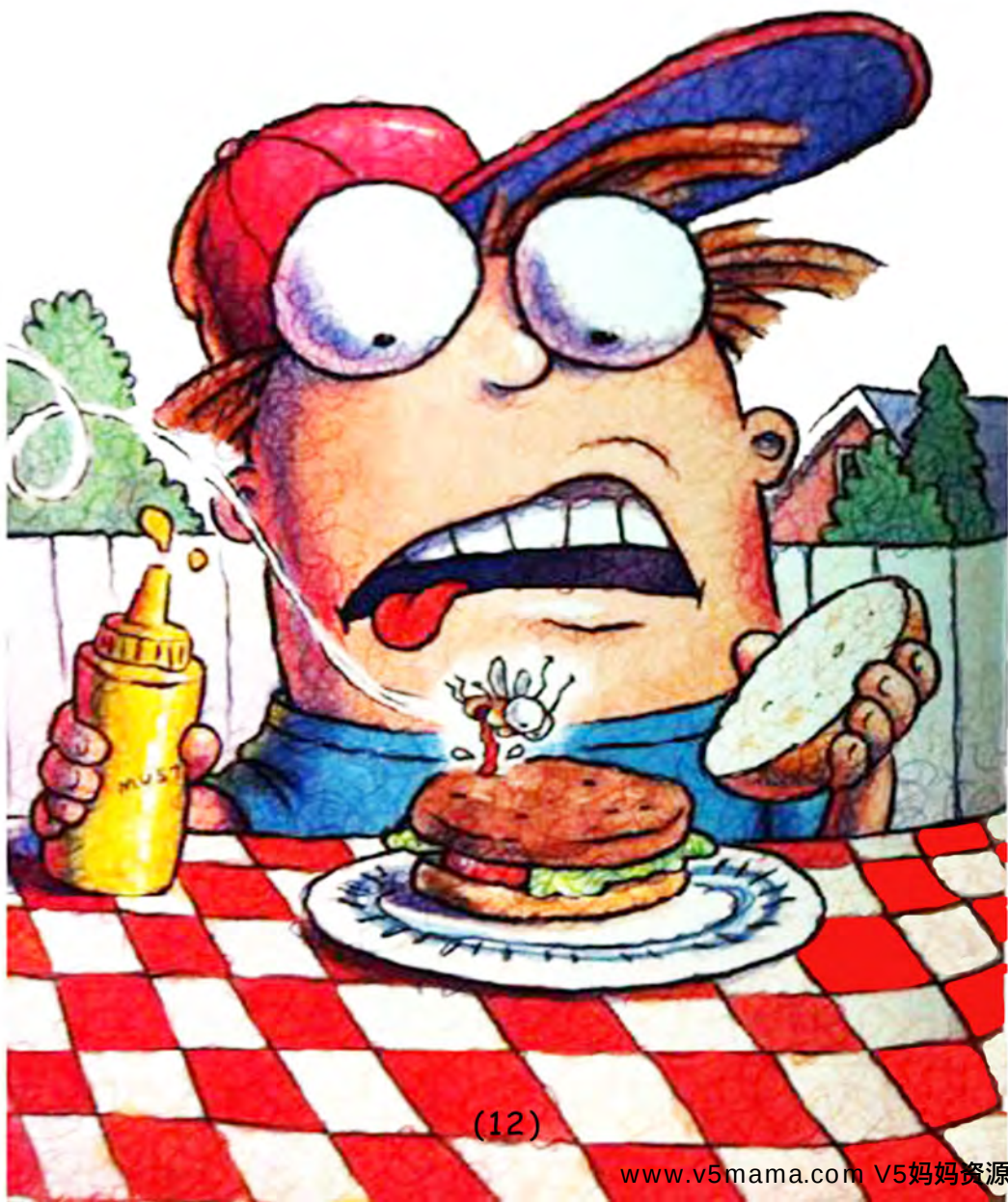


Fly Guy flew until he

"That is my hamburger!"



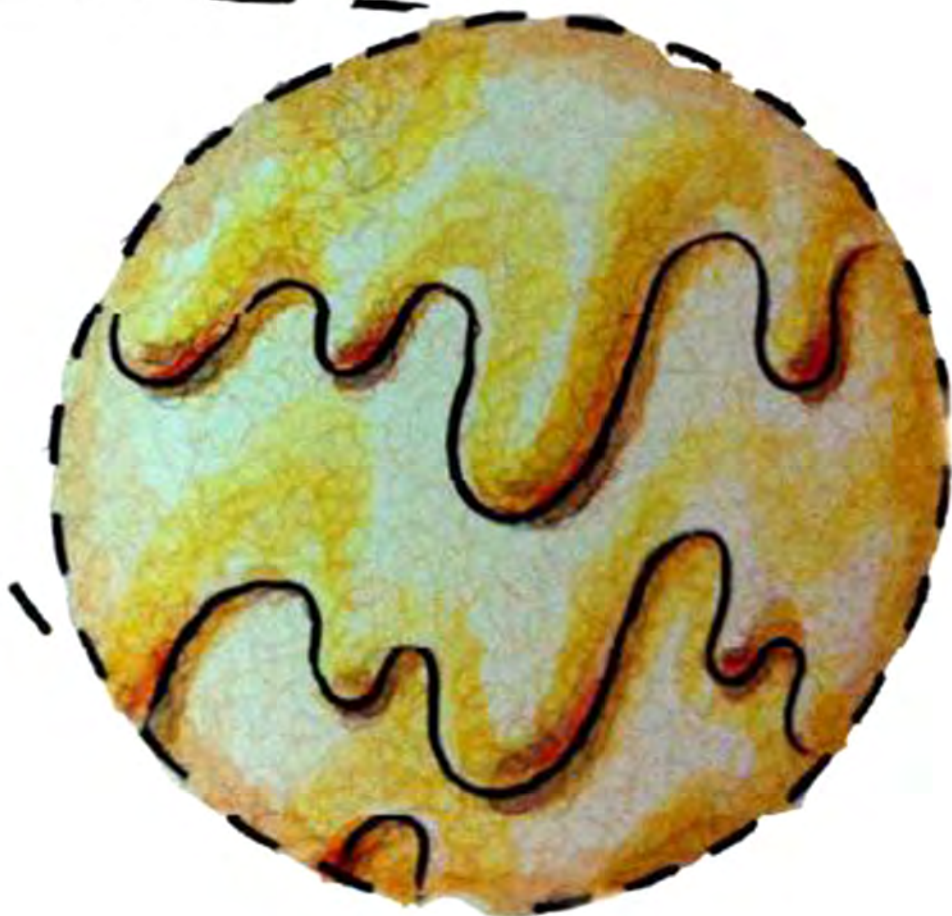

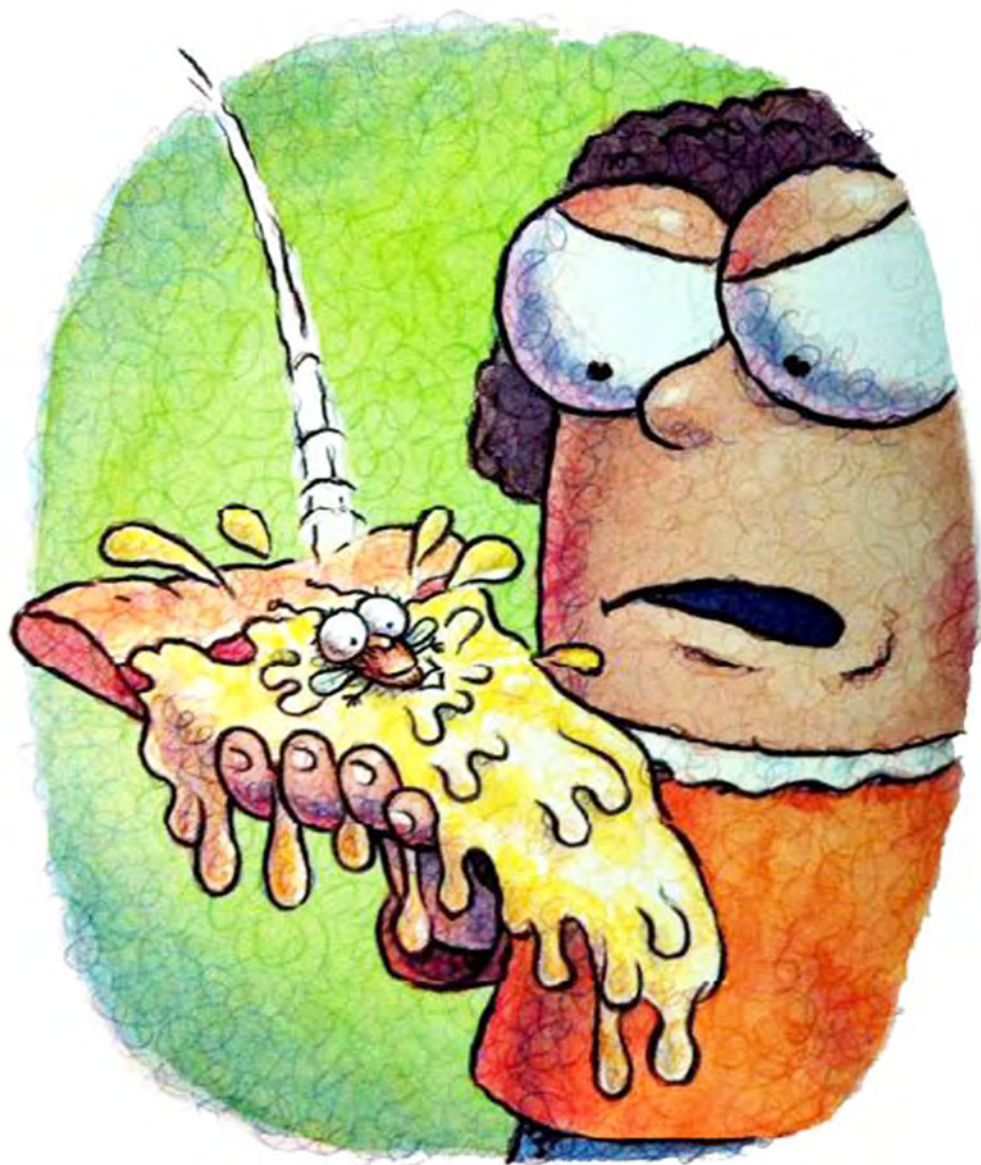


Fly Guy flew on until he

Close enough!

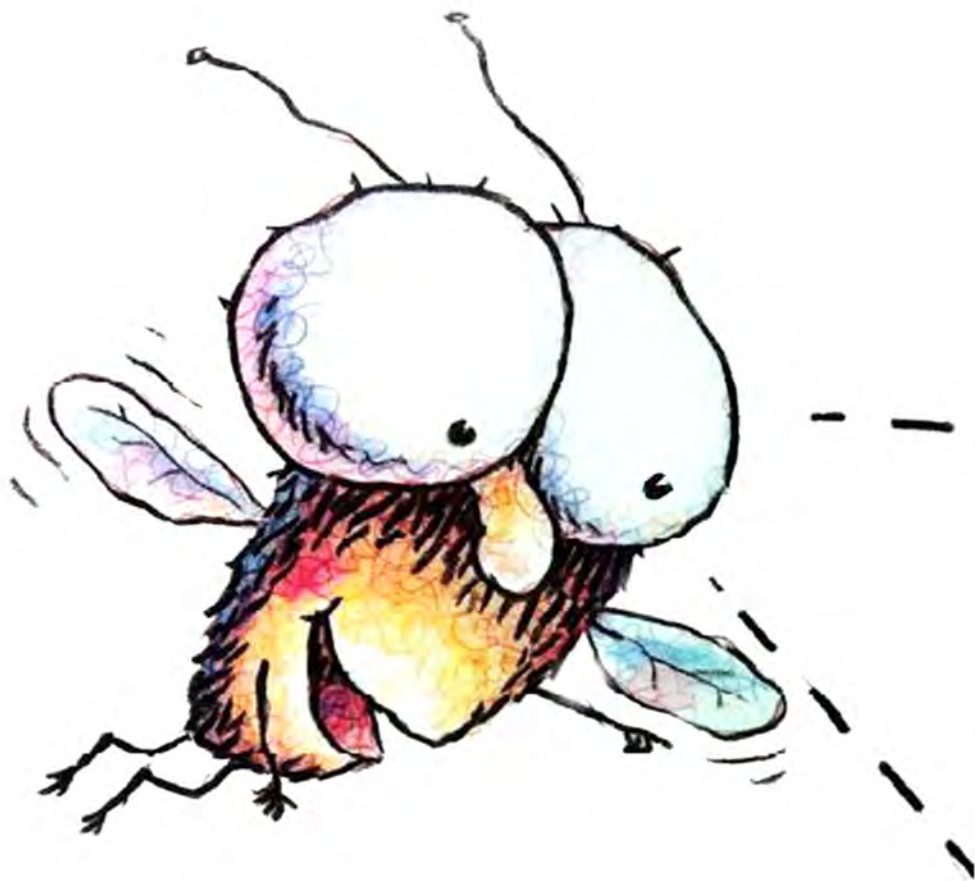


A girl yelled,
"That is my pizza!"



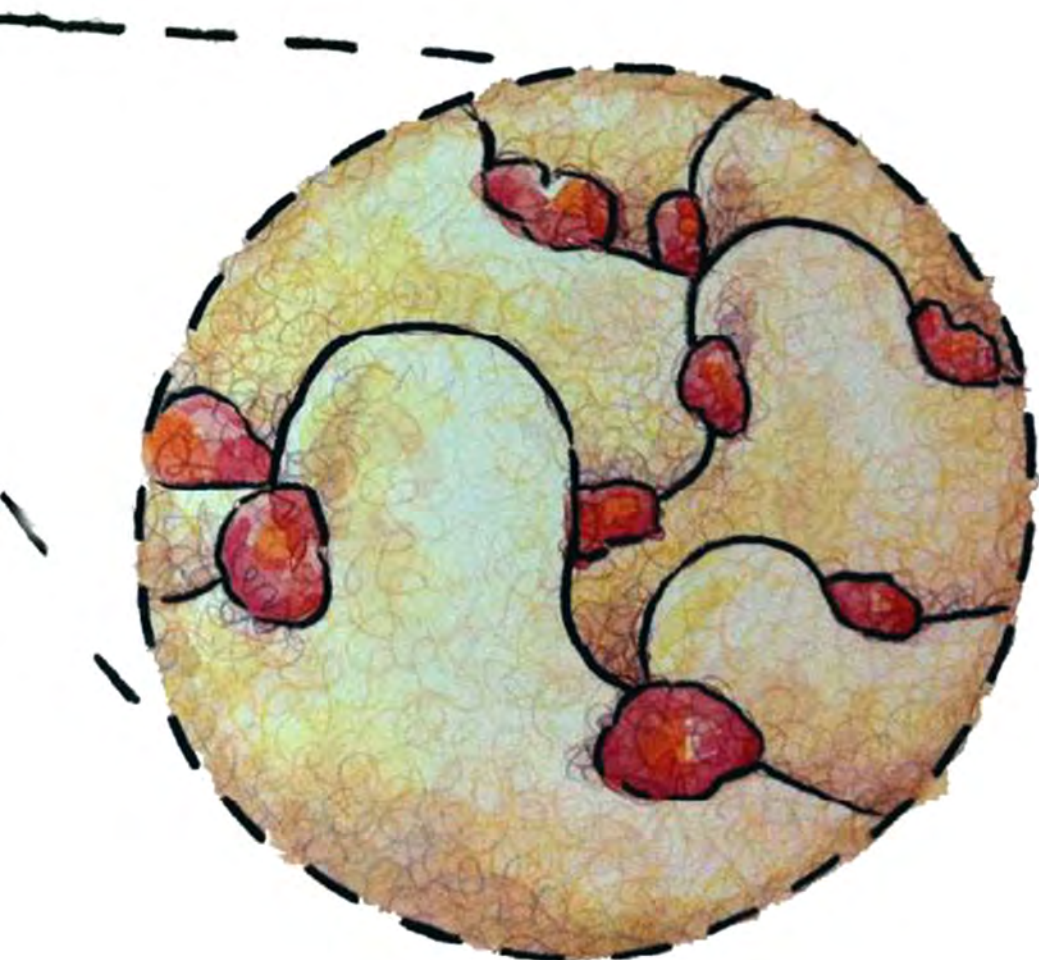

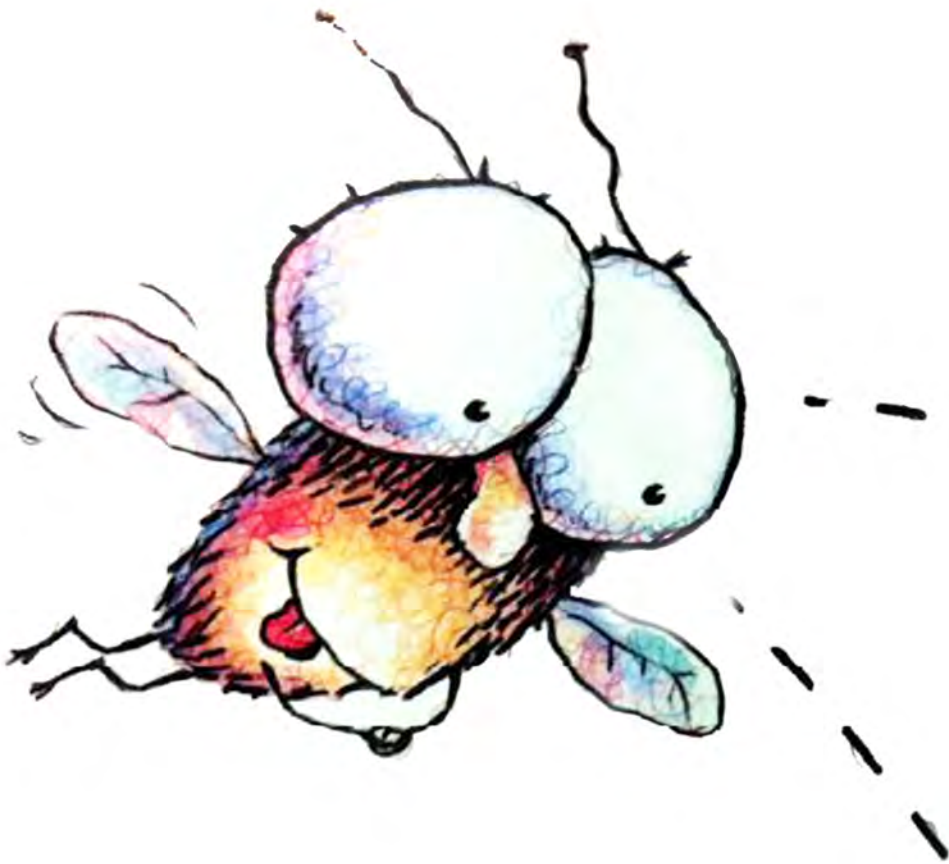


A dog growled,
"Those are my bones."



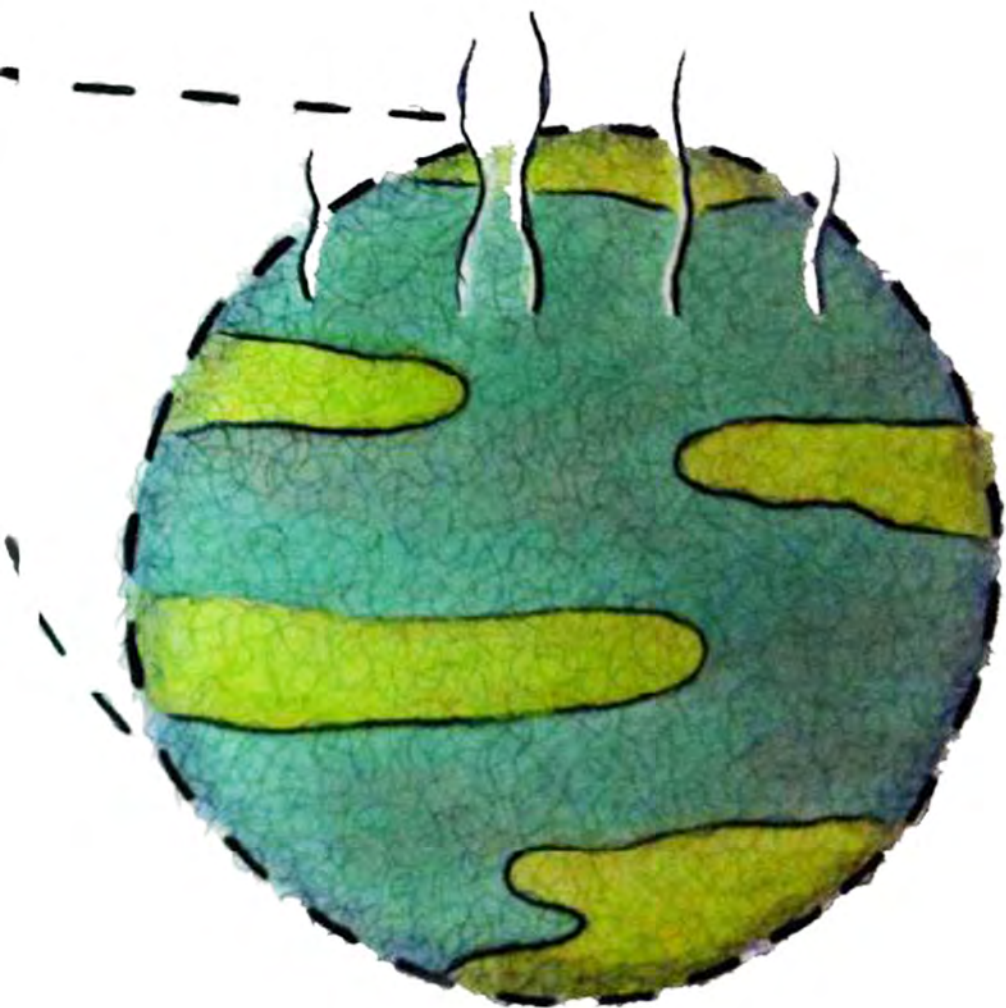

"That is my roadkill."

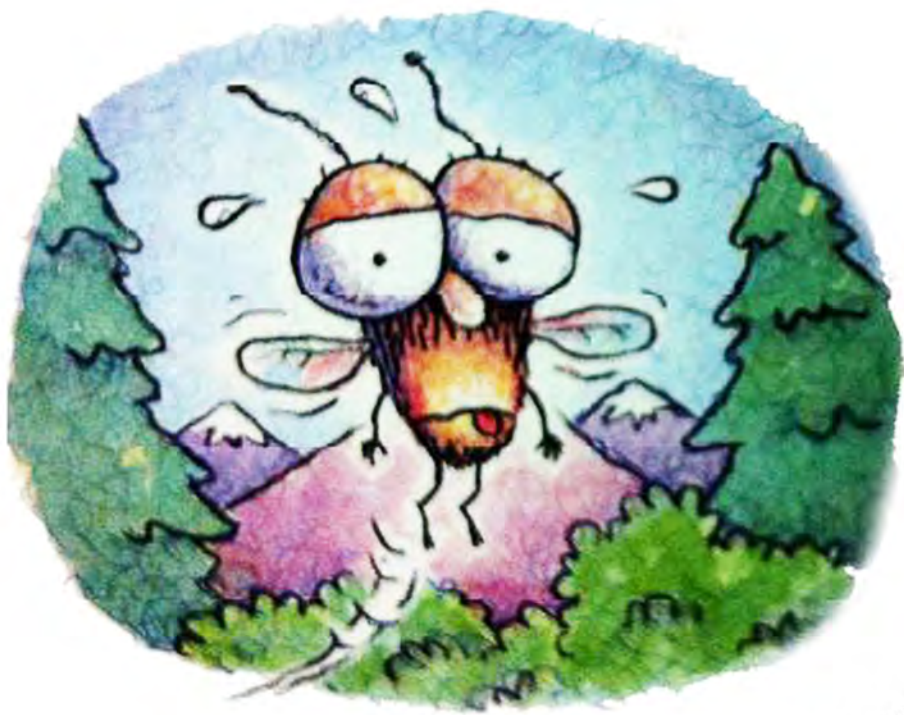

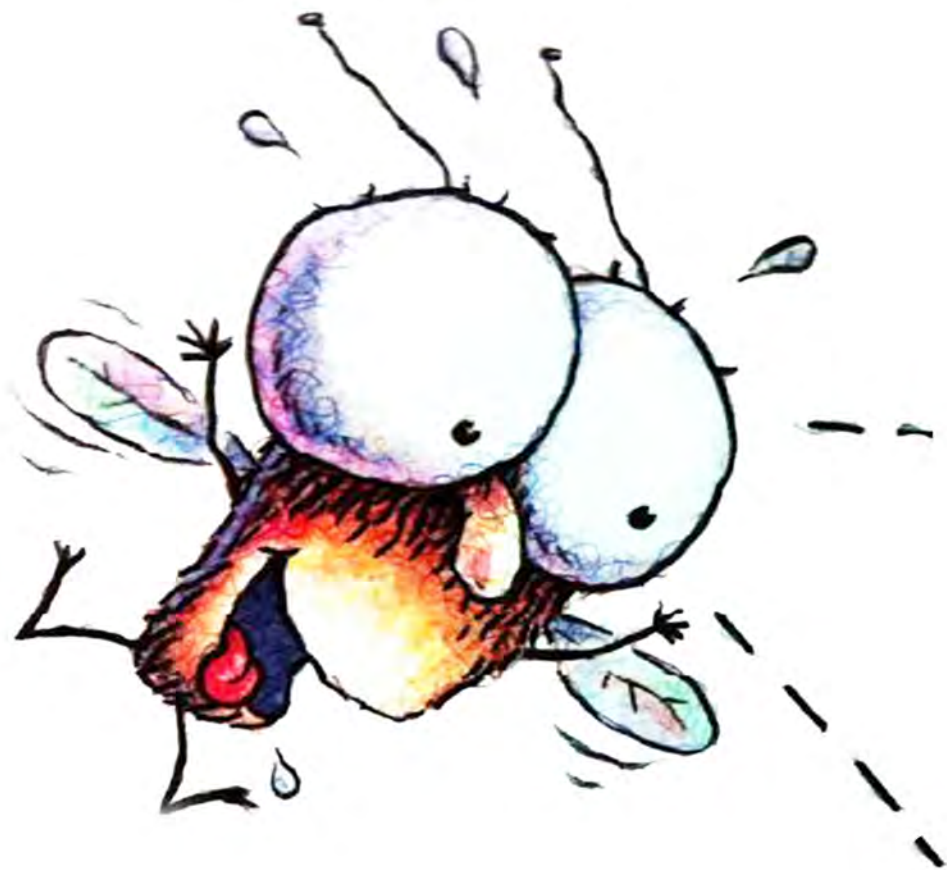
Fly Guy was very hungry.

He flew on and on and on and

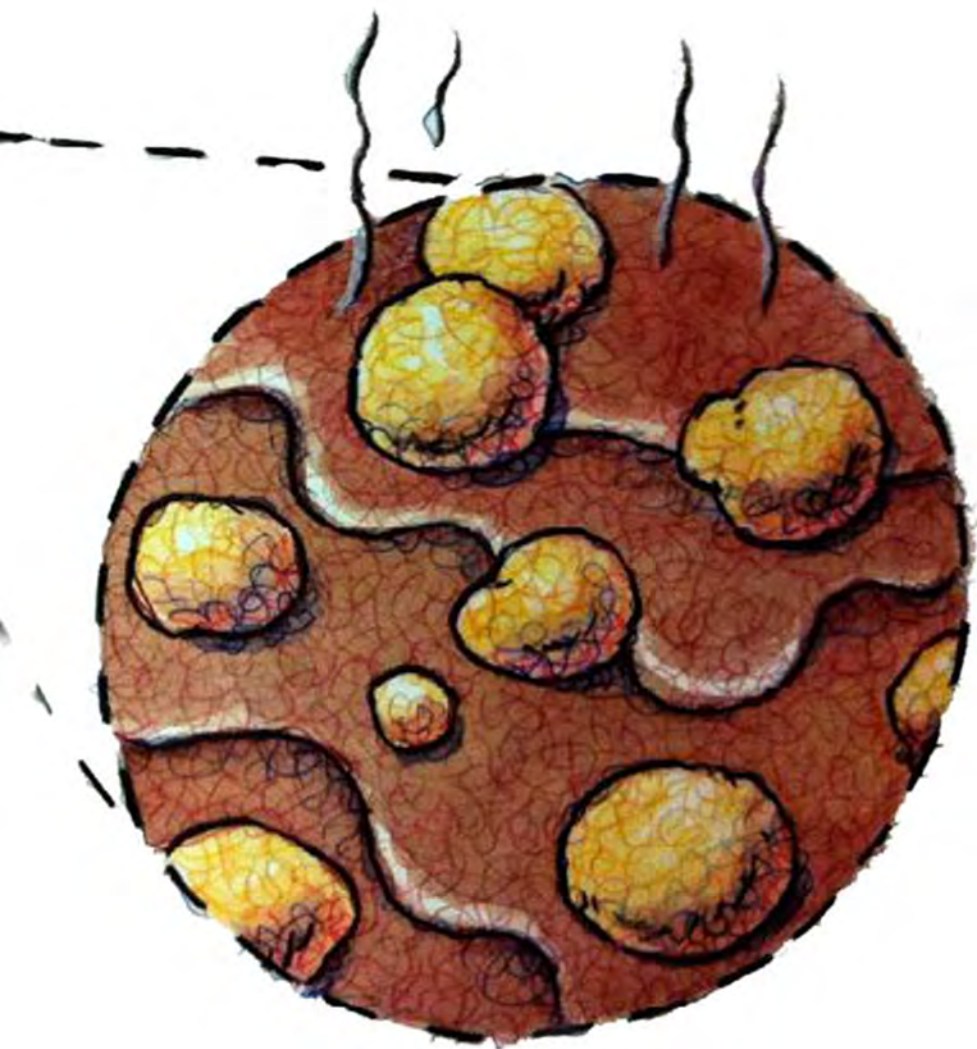

lumpy, and smelly.



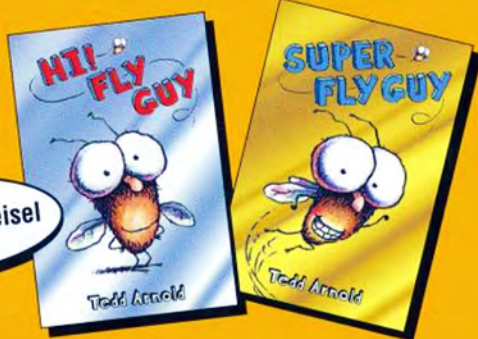
"You found our picnic!"
